

West Sacramento Economic Profile



The city of West Sacramento is optimally situated to take advantage of the full range of benefits available in Northern California. The city is located adjacent to downtown Sacramento, within a 15 minute drive to both Sacramento International and Sacramento Executive airports, and sits at the hub of a multi-modal surface transportation network of interstate highways and rail allowing access to major metro areas in the Western U.S. Additionally, the Port of West Sacramento offers a quick and easy route to the Pacific Ocean through the San Francisco Bay, allowing international access to Pacific Rim markets.



The city of West Sacramento is a paradise for those seeking outdoor recreation with outdoor walking and bike trails, the Sacramento River, and several outdoor events and farmers markets. For sports fans, West Sacramento is host to the San Francisco Giants AAA minor league baseball affiliate, the Sacramento Rivercats. With 188 sunny days a year, the region’s climate is ideal for outdoor living. If a day trip is in order, the Sacramento Region lies within a short drive of the Sierra Nevada mountain range, Napa Valley and San Francisco Bay Area.

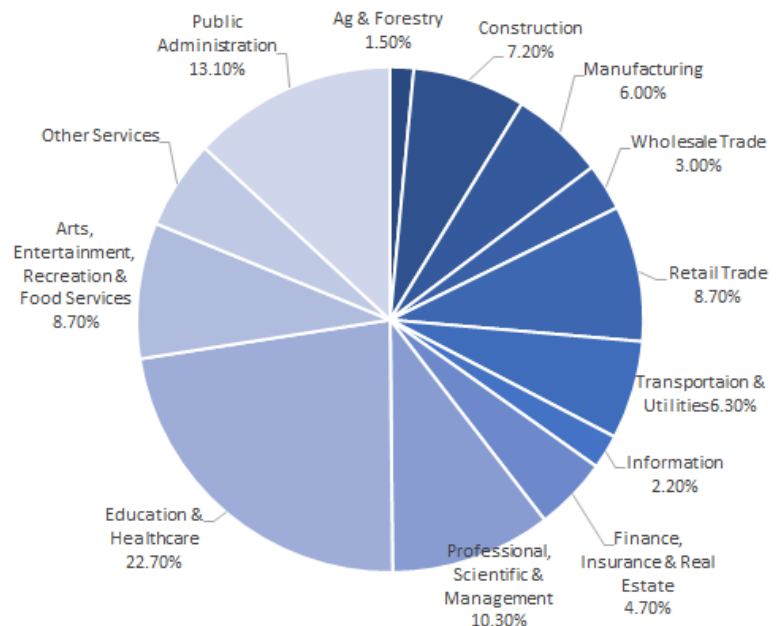
